The September 11th, 2001 attacks were the deadliest terrorist attacks in human history, causing the deaths of 2,977 people. Thousands more were injured, and long-term health effects have arisen as a consequence of the attacks.



Timeline of the first two hours:

 8:46 a.m.- Flight 11 crashes into the World Trade Center's North Tower. All passengers aboard are instantly killed, and employees of the WTC are trapped above the 91st floor.

 9:03 AM - Flight 175 crashes into the WTC's South Tower. All passengers aboard are killed instantly and so are an unknown number of people in the tower.

• 9:05 AM - President George W. Bush, in an elementary school classroom in Florida, is informed about the hit on the second tower.

9:28 AM - Hijackers attack on Flight 93.

 9:37 AM - Flight 77 crashes into the Pentagon. All passengers aboard are instantly killed and so are 125 civilian and military personnel in the building.

 9:55 AM - Air Force One with President George W. Bush aboard takes off from Florida.

 9:57 AM - Passengers aboard Flight 93 begin to run up toward the cockpit. Jarrah, the pilot, begins to roll the plane back and forth in an attempt to destabilize the revolt.

 9:59 AM - The South Tower of the World Trade Center collapses.

• 10:02 AM - Flight 93 plows into an empty field in Shanksville, Pennsylvania. Although its ultimate target is unknown, it was likely heading for either the White House or the US Capitol.

 10:28 AM - The North Tower of the World Trade Center collapses.

9/11 Statistics:

- 2,753 people were killed in New York.
- 184 people were killed at the Pentagon.
- 8 children died from the event.
- 200 fire units responded to the attacks in NY.
- 2,200 stairs were climbed by firemen and women on their way up the World Trade Center.
- 40 pounds was what firemen and women carried with them in addition to their turnout gear.
- 343 firefighters were killed.
- 8 paramedics perished.
- 23 NYPF officers were killed.
- 37 Port Authority officers were killed.
- 115 nations had citizens who were killed in the attacks.
- 36,000 units of blood were donated to the New York Blood Center.
- 3,051 children lost a parent that day.
- 34 military units responded stateside immediately following the 9/11 attacks, including the Army National Guard, US Air Force, US Coast Guard units, US Army, and Department of Defense Units.
- 40 people were killed on Flight 93 which crashed in Shanksville, PA. Todd Beamer, who was on the fourth plane in the terrorist attack called an operator to share what was happening on the plane and get a message to his pregnant wife and two kids. He is famously known for saying "Let's Roll" before sacrificing his life by helping other heroes force the plane down in a remote area.
